
AABE National Board member **Dot Harris** (GE Energy) officially installed the newly

# **GPC Rate Increase Approved**



The Georgia Public Service Commission has approved a \$321.7M/year revenue increase for Georgia Power Company (GPC) that will take effect this month. Residential customers will see their electric bills increase by an average \$5.24 per month. After the January increase, the rates will remain the same in 2009 and 2010. GPC filed for a rate increase to recover costs for installing environmental controls as required by state and federal regulations.

# **GE Energy Wins Contracts**

Atlanta based GE Energy reported \$650M in contracts to provide 333 wind turbines adding 500MW of power capacity to New York and Texas.

# Latest GA Drought Updates



Water conservation efforts in the state of Georgia have been successful but 50% of the state remains in exceptional drought conditions. Governor Sonny **Perdue** set a goal for all large users to reduce consumption by 10%. The target was 230 million gallons per day and as of December; the state reduced 348 million gallons per day. Overall water usage was down 10% in Atlanta, 10 – 15% in Gwinnett County, 15 – 20% in Cherokee County, and 20% in Cobb County. Approximately 31 out of 97 largest water users in Georgia did not meet the 10% reduction goal. Rate hikes are being considered by Clayton and Cobb Counties.

GE Water's President and CEO, Jeff Garwood, who operates the sister unit to GE Energy, recommended that the region should seriously consider creating more water reclamation projects and desalinate water from the coast of Savannah.

So far, Lake Lanier and Allatoona reservoirs are down 20 feet and Bear Creek reservoir is up 3 feet. Thanks to recent rainfall, 2007 has not been the driest year on record at 31.85 inches. In 1954, Georgia's rainfall for the year was 31.80 inches. Georgia farmers estimate crop losses in 2007 at \$787 million.

# AABE National Board Meeting

The quarterly AABE National Board of Directors and Chapter Presidents meeting was held at the Brown Convention Center in Houston, Texas from December 7<sup>th</sup> to 8<sup>th</sup>, 2007. National committee reports, presentations and teambuilding projects were conducted by the Board members.

The AABE Houston Chapter hosted the event. The meeting included updates about the administration, conference, website, chapters, scholarships and energy issues.

Various chapters introduced AABE to its newly elected Presidents. AABE's Board, members and Chapter Presidents participated in a SWOT (Strengths, Weaknesses, **Opportunities and Threats**) strategic planning session. **Outgoing AABE National Chairman Wilton Cedeno** (ConEd - NY) called the meeting to order. AABE National President and COO Frank Stewart reported on AABE policy-making activities with U.S. and international organizations.



Board member **David Owens** (pictured, EEI – DC), Chair of the National Legislative Issues and Public Policy (LIPP) Committee, presented for approval the AABE General Principles on Energy Efficiency, Energy Policy, Renewable Energy, and Energy Technology. These principles were accepted by the Board and initiatives for public release are in progress. The 2008 AABE State of Energy in Black America report will be sponsored by Board member from Atlanta, Richard Holmes (GPC – ATL). This report is in the process of being updated and will be presented during the upcoming conference in April.

Board member Warner Williams (Chevron – Southern California) presented a donation check from Chevron for \$125K towards the AABE 31<sup>st</sup> Annual Conference. Board member Dot Harris (GE Energy – ATL) will conduct the first AABE Energy Entrepreneur's Forum during the conference. AABE Southeast Region Coordinator, Corlene Williams (SNG - BHM) announced that the AABE 32<sup>nd</sup> Annual Conference will be held at the Rosen Shingle Creek Resort in Orlando, Florida during April 2009. Seattle, Washington will host the 2010 conference.

The AABE National Technology Development Committee (TDC) Vice-Chair and Atlanta Chapter Communications Chairperson Wayne Young (Honeywell) informed the board about website vendor solicitations and updates to the national and chapter websites. Wayne also previewed a draft copy of the *AABE Energy News*. The quarterly newsletter includes highlights of various AABE chapter meetings, national committee highlights, special events, energy and environmental information. The new national newsletter will be available this January to all members.

AABE Board member from Atlanta, **Ralph Cleveland** (AGL) hosted the United Negro College Fund (UNCF) to make a request in front of the Board. The UNCF wishes to partner with AABE member companies to recruit minority college graduates in their ranks.

The meeting was heavily attended by various AABE chapter representatives, committee members, committee chairpersons, board members and the national office. The next Board meeting will be held during the National Conference.

## **U.S. ENERGY NEWS:**

## **President Signs Energy Bill**



On December 19, 2007, **President George Bush** signed H.R. 6, the Energy Independence and Security Act of 2007. The measure will reduce US energy consumption 8% by 2030. The bill will save consumers \$80B by 2030 and reduce carbon emissions 20% by 2050. The legislation requires that gasoline be blended with ethanol to reduce petroleum consumption. The incandescent light bulb will be phased out within a decade to reduce their electricity use 60% by 2020. New dishwashers and washing machines are required to use 28% and 40% less water respectively. All Federal buildings will be required to become more energy efficient. The bill also calls for expansion of the renewables and nuclear energy industries.

## Washington Action Day for LIHEAP



Over 100 representatives from the National Fuel Funds Network (NFFN) member organizations. companies and allies will hold a national lobbying event for increased funding of the Low Income Home Energy Assistance Program (LIHEAP). Volunteers will visit over 200 Congressional offices, organize a press conference and hold meetings with Administration officials. The event will be held on Wednesday, January 30<sup>th</sup>. ## <u>US Participates at Bali Climate</u> <u>Conference</u>

On December 15, 2007, the US along with 189 other nations developed an agreement to mitigate climate change in a "measurable, reportable and verifiable" manner. **Paula Dobriansky**, Deputy US Secretary of State, stated, "The US is very committed to developing a long-term greenhouse gas reduction emission reduction goal." The agreement lays out an initial "road map" that aims to set a timetable and other parameters to guide negotiations on a new global climate treaty over the next two years. The new treaty will succeed the Kyoto Protocol, which expires in 2012.

January 10, 1864 – George Washington Carver, scientist and inventor, is born.

January 15, 1929 – **Reverend Dr.** Martin Luther King, Jr. is born.

January 17, 1882 – **Lewis H. Latimer** is granted a patent for the process of manufacturing carbons.

# <u>HISTORY MAKER BIOGRAPHY</u> – VICTORINE Q. ADAMS

(1912 - 2006)



Victorine Q. Adams, a Baltimore pioneer in African-American politics and civic leader, became the first black woman on the City Council nearly four decades ago.

A former schoolteacher, Mrs. Adams founded the Colored Women's Democratic Campaign Committee in 1946 to mobilize support for candidates - then invariably white - who were sympathetic to black causes, among them **Theodore R. McKeldin**, the city's last Republican mayor.

From a base in the Adams household's living room, the committee pushed for change and African-American voter registration. In 1954, the group helped stage a landmark victory when **Judge Harry A. Cole** then a young black Republican lawyer - won a state Senate seat over the white candidate backed by the entrenched Democratic Party machine of political boss **Jack Pollack**.

Mrs. Adams ran unsuccessfully in 1962 for the state Senate and four years later was elected to the House of Delegates. But she resigned after a year and won election to the City Council. She held the seat for four terms, until 1983.

Among her accomplishments was working with the Baltimore Gas and Electric Co. in 1979 to establish the Baltimore Fuel Fund, which has helped thousands of area families with winter heating bills and is now named the **Victorine Q. Adams** Fuel Fund. It became a model for other jurisdictions in Maryland and the nation.

She also pushed for urban renewal, low- and middle-income housing, improved nursing homes and increased programs to help the elderly.

The National Fuel Funds Network's (NFFN) Victorine Q. Adams Institute is a new national program to enhance the contribution of charitable energy assistance fundraising to meeting the nation's Home Energy Affordability Gap. To be held in Baltimore in September 2008, the Institute will provide two days of industry-specific, in-depth fundraising technical training for energy assistance professionals from across the United States. It will be the first in-depth forum for training and strategy development for NFFN members.


